Short Description	This report summarizes the ECEI Excellence labels assigned to EPIX project clusters (Rete di Imprese Luce in Veneto, Sustainable Infrastructure Cluster, HABIC cluster, Dutireg/STEPP cluster and MoWiN.net) within the project duration. The ECEI quality labelling system consists of three levels – Bronze, Silver and Gold. The Bronze label demonstrates that cluster management is striving for excellence and is interested in improving its management performance; the Silver quality label confirms the successful implementation of improvement processes that were initiated following a Bronze label benchmarking; the Gold Label is a quality label based on very high standards of cluster management practice.

Premises

The European Cluster Excellence Initiative (ECEI), which was initiated by the European Commission DG Enterprise and Industry in 2009, developed methodologies and tools to support cluster organisations to improve their management capacities and capabilities. The European Cluster Excellence Initiative invented a uniform set of cluster management quality indicators and developed a quality labelling system featuring the three quality labels for professional cluster management:

- ✓ BRONZE Label "Striving for Cluster Excellence"
- ✓ SILVER Label "Dedicated to Cluster Excellence"
- ✓ GOLD Label "Excel in Cluster Excellence"







The European Secretariat for Cluster Analysis (ESCA) was initiated and mandated by the ECEI to organise the assessment process and to award successful cluster organisations with the respective labels in GOLD, SILVER, and BRONZE. A network of around 200 specifically trained cluster experts from more than 30 countries supports these activities.

During the course of the EPIX project, three project partners (RI LIV, DUTIREG and SIC) carried out a benchmarking process supervised by the European Secretariat for Cluster Analysis and obtained BRONZE Label; MoWiN.net renewed its SILVER Label and HABIC cluster its GOLD Label.

ELCA unfortunately is not eligible for the ESCA benchmarking process as it is a network of clusters and not a single cluster organisation.
